Meet Jeff & Vicky Wilde who have been preparing meals in the community for the past 15 years. As many of you have told us, we don't like to cook, but we do like to eat. If you ask Jeff & Vicky, they love to cook.

Like a lot of residents, the first year they lived here they tried to do everything. Play card games, Bingo, spend time in the pool, experience different entertainment programs, dance lessons, seminars, bus trips, travels and just meet people and make new friends. Their days were so busy that they wondered how they had time to do it all. When asked if they wanted to volunteer to help in the kitchen, they didn't have to think twice, and the rest is history. They loved working with other residents in the community and learned so much while they continued to learn about food preparation. During a Health Department inspection, the County representative suggested that Jeff take the Food Managers Certification which he did.

This has given him more information and a step in ensuring compliance with local and national food safety regulations.

They started out with their home-made meals but refigured them for larger crowds. They now have different breakfast meals that they alternate monthly. Made-to-order omelets, biscuits and gravy, pancakes eggs and sausage, Farmers Casserole, egg, ham, and cheese croissant. One of the favorites of the community is when they make delicious cinnamon buns from scratch and offer them with the Farmers Casserole Breakfast.

When they made it through the first really big meal without a hitch there was no stopping them with the various meals that they have prepared over the years. With their family-style Italian Cuisine we have had the joy of eating their homemade lasagna, spaghetti & meatballs, chicken parmesan dinners. Soups, Salads, Pizza, Italian Pork, Chicken, Beef, Fish and Hobo Dinners are just some of the many meals they prepare. They have made delicious desserts too. Bread Pudding is one of their many favorites.

They have prepared meals for all the major holidays for us to enjoy. One year for New Year's Eve they prepared and served various appetizers every half hour throughout the evening and ended with breakfast after midnight. When you arrive at Jeff and Vicky's meals you will not have to wait in line to be served, they always have volunteers that will serve you your meal.

Today if you ask them why they cook, their answer is always the same. Because people love it. The joy of cooking for someone who doesn't like to cook and giving them a satisfying meal is rewarding. Seeing the camaraderie between the residents is what keeps them cooking time after time. When they are all cleaned up and heading home and there are still people sitting and conversing with each other, that's when they know why they cook.

The bumper sticker on their golf cart says it all, "Love people, cook them tasty food" And we too love that Jeff & Vicky decided to live at Las Palmas Grand!


# WOODCARVING


# HELLO PALMAS DEL SOL RESIDENTS!

# **WALKING & BIKING**

With so many people walking and bike riding here are some good things to remember:

# WALKING

If you are on a road either with or without a shoulder you should always walk against traffic ... that is, vehicles should be driving toward you. According to the National Center for Safe Routes to School www. saferoutesinfo.org, the reason is this: "(walking against traffic) presents opportunities to establish eve contact with approaching motorists and make quick judgments to protect oneself." Plus, in the evening it would be great if the walkers wore light or reflective clothing and carried some sort of light.

# **BIKING**

When you are on a bicycle, think of yourself as another vehicle on the road. So, if you are another vehicle, you should be biking WITH traffic. Don't make up traffic rules as you bike along because erratic biking behavior puts you at risk for crashes (studies have shown that a risk of a crash increases FIVE TIMES when you ride without regard for rules of traffic). Your goal is blend in with the traffic and help it flow easily. While there may be a fear that you'll be hit from behind by oncoming traffic, the reality is that rear-end collisions between vehicles and bicycles are rare; the most frequent cause of car-bike crashes are from bicyclists riding on the left side of the road. So, remember: Ride on the right.



- **3.** There are (2) burners light them one at a time by turning the knob to light and pressing the Ignitor button or the right. You will hear a "whoosh" sound when it lights.
- **4.** Once you have finished grilling turn the two knobs to the off position. You do not need to turn off the timer – it will go off on its own.
- **5.** Clean the grill and close the cover.

The following is a reminder of some ways to enhance safety and security for you and your neighbors. The stronger we are individually with security, the less inviting we are to thieves.

- 1) Lock vehicle doors, even when you are home: Thieves will move on and look for an easier target. Also make sure your vehicle trunk is closed after removing items.
- 2) Do not leave personal belongings in your vehicle, especially electronics, purses, guns, etc. Even if your door is locked, these items could result in a broken window.
- 3) Secure your golf cart when not in use. Also, do not leave the keys in the golf cart.
- 4) Secure your bicycle when not in use. Theft of bicycles continues to be an issue in the nearby area.
- 5) For those of you with garage doors, check to be sure they are closed after returning home and before you lock up for the night. Thieves can be in and out of your garage in just a couple of minutes.
- 6) When walking at night, be sure to wear reflective clothing or carry a flashlight. Use the same rules of the road as during the day-time—walk against traffic. Do NOT Walk in the middle of the road at any time of the day or night.
- 7) Adhere to the speed limit in the community and obey STOP signs whether you are in a car/vehicle, golf cart or bicycle. There have been many "close calls" that could have ended in severe injury.
- 8) When you see something unusual or concerning, say something. Contact your Street Captain or George Griffin (860-798-5866).

These are a few of the ways that YOU can help Las Palmas remain a safe/secure community.

# MANAGER'S CORNER

Well, the heat is here and what better place to stay cool than the clear, blue waters of our community pool! So, while you're floating around this summer, here's some cool pool points to ponder...

- The Las Palmas Grand pool hold 118,000 gallons of water!
- On average, 7 gallons of liquid chlorine are put into the pool each day.
- Chlorine is made from salt brine hence, the salty taste.
- Pebble Tech surfacing covers the floor and walls of the pool.
- The pool is on an automated system that regulates the pH balance each day.
- On average, it takes our Maintenance team approximately 1.5 hours to clean the pool each morning and that's assuming there wasn't any wind or storm the previous night.
- The pool is surrounded by 38 palms, 5 cabanas, 12 umbrellas, and 48 loungers.
- Whatever is on your body (lotions, oils, perfumes, etc.) when entering the pool, stays in the pool. For this reason, we ask that each pool-goer rinse off in the outdoor shower prior to use.
- Preventative maintenance is done on the pool each year. This includes draining, acid washing, tile cleaning, and re-caulking



around the edges. The pool deck may also be re-painted and other repairs completed, as needed.

- Children's hours at the pool are 11:00am 1:00pm, and 3:00pm 5:00pm daily; as well as 7:00pm 9:00pm on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturday evenings.
- Running, diving, and jumping are prohibited at the LPG pool.
- All guests must be accompanied by an LPG resident when using the pool.
- Gate keys are available to all residents just ask the front desk!
- During the summer months and for special events, our Activities department schedules pool parties with live entertainment for all LPG residents.
- Dive-In movies are offered throughout the summer months. What a great way to cool off on those hot nights!

Stay cool in the pool this summer and thank you for making Las Palmas Grand your home!
