A SEASON FOR THANKSGIVING

“Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few.” Winston Churchill August 1940..... True then. True now, four score and five years later.

As we Americans prepare to celebrate a national day of Thanksgiving on Thursday, November 27, we cannot overlook those “so few” Americans who daily rise to the occasion in defense of our astonishingly beautiful and bountiful homeland and have done so for two-and-one-half centuries. America’s beloved armed forces have earned the right of recognition and gratitude at our tables of Thanksgiving.

History tells us that in 1621 following the Pilgrims struggle through a harsh winter, the Separatists and Wampanoag native people celebrated a successful harvest with a multi-day feast in Plymouth, Massachusetts. This historical event became the basis for a national holiday, first proclaimed by President George Washington in 1789 and officially made a federal holiday by Abraham Lincoln in the 1860s. Fast forward to today, and it’s a time for families and friends to come together and build community, express thanks, and share a meal with all the traditional trimmings.



The holiday’s core meaning is to look inward and acknowledge the blessings in life, big and small. It’s a day to reflect on the historical origins of the holiday and to consider its legacy. And it’s a time to acknowledge and give thanks to our armed forces for their role in defending our freedom from oppression for the last 250 years.

There are many channels to offer thanks and support for our military and veteran community. One such channel exists right here within our own neighborhood. The Thesman Communities RED Friday Patriots is a group of veterans and non-veterans who assemble every Friday morning for a breakfast meeting to honor America’s deployed warfighters. R.E.D. is an acronym for Remember Everyone Deployed, all 228,000 of them who are currently deployed to 150 countries representing America’s interests. Our group of Patriots, many of whom are your neighbors, now exceeds 350 active members and has held 335 consecutive Friday assemblies to honor our deployed service members. A buffet breakfast is served beginning at 7:30 AM (\$12pp), and the programs start at 8:15 AM. American Legion Post 27, 1018 S. Meridian Road, Apache Junction. Join us. Wear RED. Give thanks.



Have you given thought to the fact that America is only a few months and a wake-up call away from celebrating its 250th birthday on Saturday, July 4, 2026, marking the Semi-quincentennial anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence. Our nation is already underway in observing this milestone with year-long programs and celebrations leading up to the major event, which can also be referred to as America250 or the Quarter Millennium. Imagine what a festive event that day will be like.

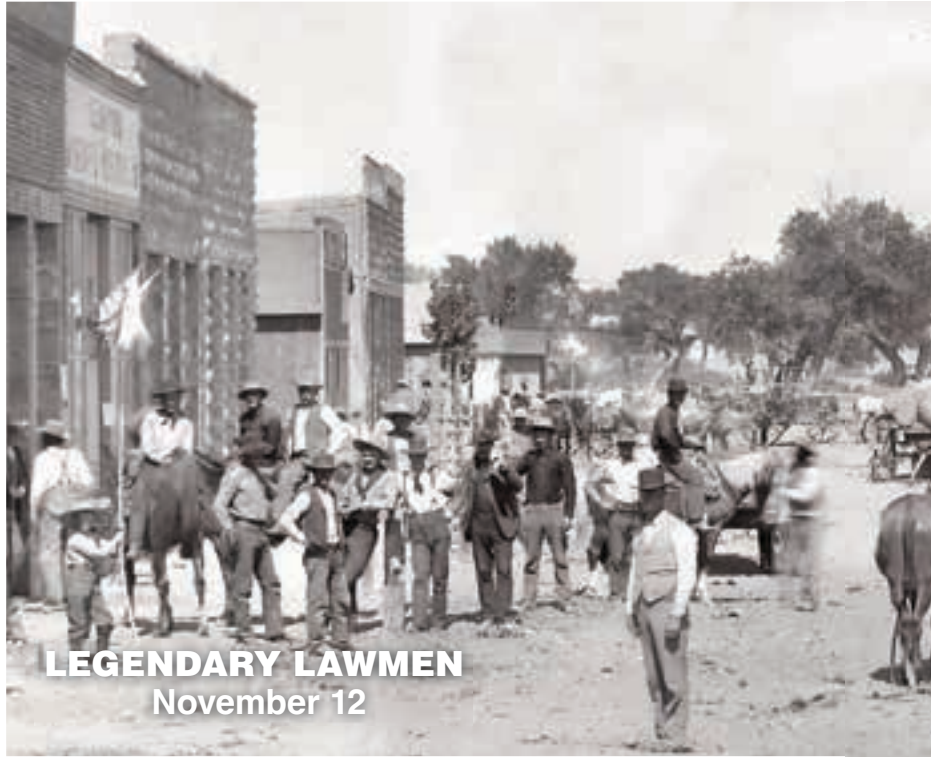

RONALD AND JEANETTE WERLE
76 YEARS TOGETHER AND STILL GOING STRONG

Ronald and Jeanette Werle don't credit grand gestures or sweeping romance for their 76-year marriage. Instead, as they marked their anniversary on August 31, 2025, the Mesa couple say their relationship has endured because of something simpler: adaptability. "When you marry young, you're very much in love. Then you have a bunch of kids, Then, you're very poor," Jeanette said. "It's very hard to live without one another. The secret is adaptability.

"We're time travelers - as times change, we change too. That's how you stay in love." The Werles first crossed paths in Chicago as children, when Ronald, then 10, would stop by the delicatessen Jeanette's father owned to pick up bread for his father's restaurant. They stayed connected through their neighborhood and by their late teens, decided to elope. Now in their mid-90s, the Werles have raised six children, welcomed 10 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren, and spent more than five decades rooted in Mesa, where they moved in 1972 to be closer to family.

Jeanette built a career in education, teaching kindergarten through 12th grade as a resource teacher. She started the English as a Second Language program in Scottsdale and launched a television station at Scottsdale High School. She also taught journalism at Coronado High School in Scottsdale. Ronald spent years driving trucks before be-



coming a building inspector for the City of Mesa and a homebuilder. Jeanette admits their life together wasn't always wine and roses.

"I fell in and out of love six times over the decades," she reflected. "But cohesion and trust

always brought our relationship back stronger." Currently, the Werles find joy in simple pastimes: playing pinochle, going out to eat –often at Popeye's for fried chicken – and watching television together.

Their son John Werle, a retired Boeing vice president, calculated that his parents have beaten formidable odds in staying together as long as they have. He said that of 150 million marriages in modern U.S. history, only a few hundred couples make it to a 76th anniversary. "That means the odds are roughly one in tens of millions," John said. His parents' reflections on marriage are straightforward. For couples facing rough patches, Jeanette advised, "Ask yourself, is my life better with him or her, or without?" Looking back, she says the key is understanding the difference between fleeting feelings and something deeper.

"Romance doesn't last," she said. "Love does." The Werles laugh at their own longevity. Once they both cracked open a fortune cookie with the message: "You are doomed to a happy marriage." Ronald quipped, "It was written in a cookie."

And 76 years later, that fortune cookie message still holds true.

WALKING & BIKING

With so many people walking and bike riding here are some good things to remember:

WALKING

If you are on a road either with or without a shoulder you should always walk against traffic ... that is, vehicles should be driving toward you. According to the National Center for Safe Routes to School [www. saferoutesinfo.org](http://www.saferoutesinfo.org), the reason is this: “(walking against traffic) presents opportunities to establish eye contact with approaching motorists and make quick judgments to protect oneself.” Plus, in the evening it would be great if the walkers wore light or reflective clothing and carried some sort of light.

BIKING

When you are on a bicycle, think of yourself as another vehicle on the road. So, if you are another vehicle, you should be biking WITH traffic. Don't make up traffic rules as you bike along because erratic biking behavior puts you at risk for crashes (studies have shown that a risk of a crash increases FIVE TIMES when you ride without regard for rules of traffic). Your goal is blend in with the traffic and help it flow easily. While there may be a fear that you'll be hit from behind by oncoming traffic, the reality is that rear-end collisions between vehicles and bicycles are rare; the most frequent cause of car-bike crashes are from bicyclists riding on the left side of the road. So, remember: Ride on the right.

As Thanksgiving approaches, we’re reminded how lucky we are to share good food, good company, and good memories here at our lovely Las Palmas 55+ community. In the spirit of gratitude and togetherness, we’re sharing a bit of Thanksgiving history — and a favorite seasonal recipe sure to bring smiles around your holiday table.

Why We Celebrate Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving traces its roots back to 1621, when the English Pilgrims at Plymouth shared a harvest feast with the Wampanoag people, who had helped them survive their first harsh winter. The three-day celebration was filled with food, fellowship, and gratitude for a successful harvest. While turkey may or may not have been served at that first feast—wild fowl like duck, goose, and venison were more common—it eventually became the star of the modern Thanksgiving table.

The holiday evolved over time, with local celebrations of thanks held throughout the colonies. In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln made Thanksgiving a national holiday, encouraging Americans to pause and give thanks even during the Civil War.

Why the Turkey Takes Center Stage.

As for the turkey, it earned its place as the traditional centerpiece because it was a plentiful native bird large enough to feed a crowd—perfect for a communal feast. Benjamin Franklin even once suggested the turkey, rather than the bald eagle, should be America’s national bird, calling it “a true original native of America.”

Today, we continue to gather with family and friends, share our favorite dishes, and celebrate the same spirit of gratitude and community that began over 400 years ago.



RECIPE SPOTLIGHT: CLASSIC SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE

No Thanksgiving table feels complete without this comforting dish — creamy, lightly spiced sweet potatoes topped with a buttery, crunchy pecan streusel.

Ingredients

For the filling:

- 4 cups mashed cooked sweet potatoes (about 4 large)
- ½ cup sugar
- 2 large eggs
- ½ cup milk
- 4 tablespoons of melted butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon (optional)

For the topping:

- ½ cup brown sugar
- ⅓ cup flour
- 3 tablespoons of melted butter
- 1 cup chopped pecans

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.
2. In a large bowl, mix all filling ingredients until smooth and creamy. Pour into the prepared dish.
3. In a small bowl, combine brown sugar, flour, melted butter, and pecans. Sprinkle evenly over the top.
4. Bake for 30–35 minutes, until the topping is golden and the casserole is heated through.

This sweet potato casserole brings all the cozy flavors of fall to your holiday table — rich, warm, and made to share with the ones you’re thankful for.

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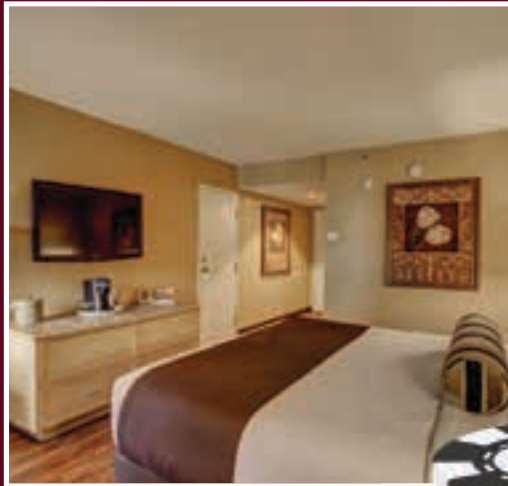

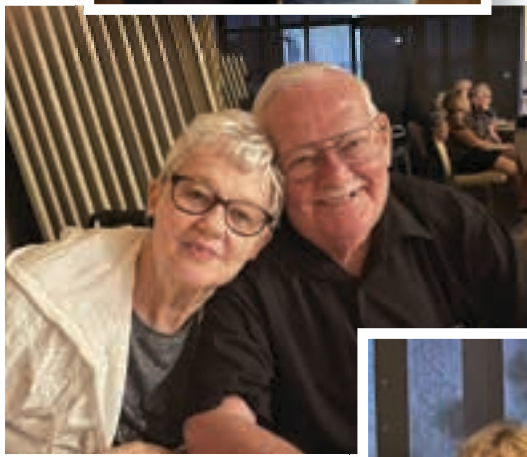
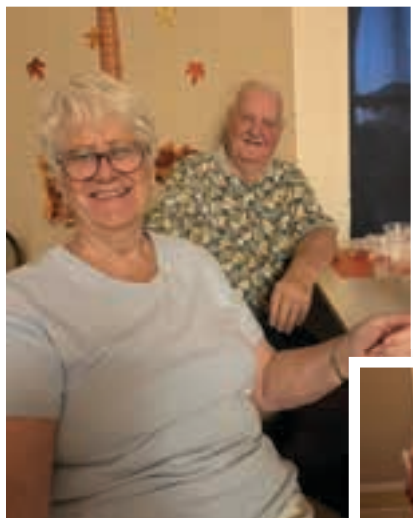
